A message from the executive director

My first year of service with the Richland Academy of the Arts (RAA) has been both challenging and stimulating. It's been a year of learning about the Academy's rich history of serving Mansfield and the surrounding communities.

Having lived in nearby Lexington for over a decade, I was aware of RAA's significant educational and performance opportunities, but I didn't closely follow course offerings or performances. My commute to Malone University in Canton, where I served as a music professor, keyboard studies coordinator, and director of the preparatory program, kept me busy.



I've enjoyed learning about RAA's history and am deeply committed to its mission. Given my background in music, the Academy's music, visual arts, dance, and theatre programs were a natural fit. In addition to learning more about our martial arts program offerings, I've focused on

better understanding the community school sponsorship side of the house.

I suspect I'm not the only Richland County resident somewhat unfamiliar with community schools – also known as charter schools – as most have historically been located in Ohio's eight urban areas since first established in 1997. Today, Richland County is home to six community schools, and Richland Academy of the Arts is the proud sponsor of seven located in Akron, Columbus, Cincinnati, Lorain, and Tiffin. As a community school sponsor, the Academy's responsibilities include oversight and monitoring, as well as providing technical assistance. I'm proud of our "Effective" rating by the Ohio Department of Education and appreciate program director Mrs. Sheri Hughes' leadership and commitment to education standards in this area of RAA's mission.

On the arts side of the house, I've focused on a thorough review of our mix and schedule of offerings. Most of our faculty hold full-time positions in addition to teaching at the Academy, which has limited our ability to offer classes during the day. I'm pleased to have hired several new faculty who are available to teach day classes, which will undoubtedly appeal to some of those we serve, given their diversity — from toddlers to seniors.

RAA is grateful to all who support its mission to foster the creative potential in those we serve. Donation and scholarship highlights include:

- \$6,289 in support of the Dance Another Day dance floor replacement project;
- \$2,230 in student scholarships from the Neil A. Doerman Scholarship Fund;
- \$1,000 contributing to awards totaling \$2,265 for RAA student music scholarships from the Barkdull Scholarship Fund; and,
- \$241 through the Kroger Community Rewards program which allows RAA supporters to donate to local organizations based on shopping they do every day.

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Every grant helps!

Richland Academy of the Arts (RAA) is fortunate to receive support from so many generous state and local agencies and foundations, sponsors and donors, all of whom help bring out the best in our community. Over the past five years, grant funding from three key organizations has totaled more than \$363,000.

The Ohio Arts Council – a state agency dedicated to ensuring equity and resilience in Ohio's arts and cultural sector – funds quality arts experiences to strengthen Ohio communities culturally,

educationally and economically. Through its various

grant funding programs, the Council provides support to artists and to make arts activities available to a broad segment of Ohioans. OAC sustainability grants awarded to RAA over the past five years total more than \$133,000, helping to cover operational and programming expenses.

Richland County Foundation raises funds for many local not-for-profit organizations through its Richland Gives initiative. The foundation's fundraising tool was developed to coincide with Giving Tuesday, which supports not-for-profits with fundraising efforts and education. Richland County

Foundation and its Richland Gives initiative have provided nearly \$150,000 over the past five years in support of various RAA initiatives including:

- Phase 1 of the Dance Another Day dance floor replacement project, supported by Robert and Esther Black Family Foundation Fund;
- Reinvesting in the Future Grant, Phases 1 & 2, which replaced fluorescent lighting with LED lighting throughout the main building, supported by Robert and Esther Black Family Foundation Fund;
- Winter and Summer internships for local full-time college students, allowing RAA to employ 14 interns in dance, marketing, music, visual arts and administrative support over the past five years, by the Fran and Warren Rupp Advised Fund;
- Professional development in development and fundraising for staff, by the Osborne Meese Grant Prizes, IUPUI, Lilly Family School of Philanthropy;
- Participation in Richland Gives and Giving Tuesday for the past five years, earning grant prizes thanks to the support of community partners including the RAA board of directors, friends, students, faculty and staff. RAA received Leader Board grant prizes totaling \$15,000 and a custom video by DMI valued at \$1,000; and,
- Scholarship fundraising activities during Richland Gives, the Barkdull Scholarship Fundraiser and the Marianne Cooper Music Scholarship Fundraiser to help make art programs accessible for all, supported by the Thomas Family Fund and the Robert J. and Stella F. Sutter Fund.

Area Agency on Aging – a division of the Ohio Department of Aging – also provides grants that support free programming for Ohio seniors, 60 years and older. AAA grant funds totaling nearly \$81,000 over the past five years have supported RAA's:

Our impact: A quick look at 2022-2023

Richland Academy of the Arts (RAA) proudly serves students of all ages in Richland, Ashland, Crawford, Knox, Morrow and Erie counties. We're committed to providing opportunities for our students to explore who they are, and who they can become, through dance (including yoga and pilates), music, theatre, visual arts and martial arts. We exist to enrich the lives of our students and community members – through events and performances, community programs and workshops – within a safe, professional environment as they discover their inner artist. In the 2022-2023 fiscal year alone, RAA's contributions are reflected in a number of ways:

- Foot traffic in weekly classes of 40,042 an increase of 8% over the previous year;
- Total class registrations in dance, music, art, theatre and martial arts of 3,085 up 16%;
- Student enrollment of 1,856 up 17%;
- Total attendees of 13,207 at various RAA events up 50%; and,
- A total of 11,329 classes offered up 37%; and,
- Tuition assistance and scholarships totaling \$29,512.

Nearly 3 in 4 would like the ability to pay online at the time of registration; and,
Nearly 95% prefer to receive communication/information from RAA via email.

We also seek to better understand the needs of families that homeschool through a recently launched survey. If you haven't yet participated, please <u>click here</u> to do so. Here's what we've learned from respondents so far:

- Nearly 2/3 are interested in adding arts enrichment programming to their curriculum;
- Nearly 85% are interested in dance (which includes yoga and pilates);
- More than 80% are interested in music;
- ∼ 77% are interested in theatre;
- Nearly 3 in 4 are interested in visual arts;
- About 46% are interested in martial arts;
- Respondents are interested in programming throughout the day -- the majority between 10 a.m. and 12 noon
- Respondents are interested in programming Monday through Saturday, with Wednesday and Saturday the lowest preferences;
- 54% of respondents are willing to pay for tuition and materials and the remaining 46% maybe be willing to pay; and,
- More than 80% of respondents are not knowledgeable of Ohio's Afterschool Child Enrichment (ACE) Program which allows qualifying families with students ages 6-18 enrolled in RAA arts programs to receive up to \$1,000 reimbursement (per student).
