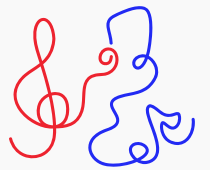
In describing the role of philanthropy, the Charities Aid Society notes that it has the power to influence lasting social change. It continues: When an organization receives support, a 'ripple effect' takes place. Many lives are touched, potentially for generations. Philanthropy can be looked at as one of the cornerstones of a stable society. When people come together to help others, whether donating money or time, we're reminded what it means to be human. And from there, communities grow stronger.

Beyond the benefits to society, philanthropy enriches the lives of those who give, broadening our perspectives and developing a stronger sense of empathy. Giving contributes to greater overall happiness, lower stress levels and a heightened sense of connection to others.

Richland Gives is a local online giving event designed to encourage everyone to contribute to local nonprofits they care about through a single giving platform/website. The Richland Foundation hosts Richland Gives to build capacity, grow philanthropy and strengthen the community.

The 2023 Richland Gives campaign is slated for November 13–28. The theme for RAA is “Giving the Gift of the Arts,” with a campaign goal of \$15,000 and a focus on the general fund, the Neil Doerman Endowed Scholarship Fund, and donor directed contributions to programs of their choice. Richland Gives’ early giving kicks off on November 13 and the campaign runs through November 27; Richland Gives is Tuesday, November 28. On November 28, the Golden Ticket Hour is from 12 to 1 p.m.

“Last year, we raised more than \$9,000 during the Richland Gives campaign.” Madore said. “We placed fourth for the most dollars raised and fifth for the most unique donors. This year we hope to win a \$500 bonus grant for the most unique donors contributing during the Golden Ticket Hour. Giving during the Golden Ticket Hour is a great way for supporters to make their gifts even more impactful.”

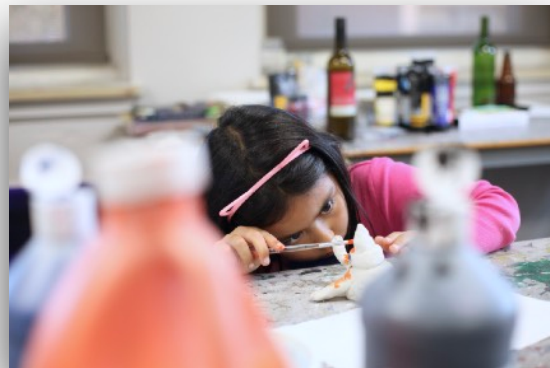
“Richland Gives is a marvelous opportunity to impact the community in a meaningful way,” Executive Director Dr. Michael Benson said. “Beyond the campaign and funding from the state, we are blessed to receive grants, scholarships and individual contributions throughout the year.”

“We’re also grateful to those who donate their talents and time as volunteers,” he continued. “Throughout my arts career, I’ve never worked in an environment where contributions were not much needed and appreciated.”

According to Dr. Benson, “thanks to strong community support RAA has helped ensure that everyone in the community – regardless of their income – can participate in arts education.

“All of our fundraising activities are about making the arts accessible to everyone,” Madore said. “The strong support we receive not only helps cover operating costs, but it also allows us to take arts programming into our local community.”

“We’re excited to launch the 2023 Richland Gives campaign and thank supporters in advance for their impactful gifts to the Richland Academy and other great local nonprofits.”



The impact of philanthropy

Donations, sponsorships and grants are fuel to Richland Academy of the Arts' engine – they are what drives RAA offerings and activities, and RAA's service to members of the Mansfield and surrounding communities. Last year alone, generous contributions from valued partners were hugely impactful in so many ways:

Scholarships and Tuition Assistance – Donations helped support 161 awards totaling over \$27,000 to students studying the arts;

Dance Another Day Project, Phase 1 – Donations and grants totaling more than \$36,000 supported the installation of new sprung dance floors in Studios 1 and 2, providing the best environment for instruction and training. RAA's dance studios are used seven days a week, 12 months of the year for classes, rehearsals, performances and special community events. Over the past five years, more than 4,200 students have participated in RAA's dance programs, special events and performances. In addition to grant funding, community donations to the project totaled more than \$6,000;

Theatre and Music Department – Thanks to strong sponsor support, more than 300 people attended four free productions. Music Department sponsorships supported eight free student music recitals enjoyed by more than 750 attendees.

Nutcracker Ballet – Funding of this program supported two ticketed performances attended by more than 1,250 people and a free student performance attended by nearly 550 Shelby City Schools students and homeschool families.

60+ Educational Programing – Sponsored by the state Area Agency on Aging, these programs offer free participation in dance, music, visual arts and theatre programs to more than 150 Richland County seniors, as well as enrichment trips to the Cleveland Art Museum, Toledo Art Museum, Ohio Light Opera and the Renaissance Theatre.

Richland Gives Donations – Generous community members contributed more than \$9,000 in support of Richland Academy of the Arts' day-to-day operations and quality programming. Thanks to donors from throughout the community, RAA served more than 1,850 students who participated in nearly 3,100 classes. Nearly 5,900 individuals attended 35 free and ticketed RAA productions, performances and gallery exhibits.
